## **Urology Resource Analysis and Service Redesign**

## Background

Coastal West Sussex Clinical Commissioning Group (CWS CCG) has identified the potential to make improvements in the consistency and quality of care currently received by male patients with LUTS and improve the productivity of the broader urology pathway. In particular variations in patient management and use of referral pathways (including diagnostics and broader secondary car activity) are known to exist between primary care practices and between to the two principal hospital sites of the main acute provider for the CCG. This offers the opportunity to shift patient care into primary care and a specialist community nurse-led Lower Urinary Tract Symptoms (LUTS) service

Analysis of available data (e.g. referral, prescribing, admissions) and interactions with stakeholders involved in the provision care for the management of LUTS will provide evidence which can provide a baseline understanding of current performance prior to any redesign.

Through analysis of all the LUTS urology services available for male patients, the precise offering of each service will be understood and a clear picture of the resource use at practice level can be built. This will allow the identification of areas where efficiency gains can be made. Decisions on service redesign will be made by local commissioners based on the results of the analysis.
